ADULT MINISTRY TRIP TO GUATEMALA IN NOVEMBER

First Baptist Church has been partners in ministry with Good Shepherd Ministries (GSM) near Quetzaltenango, Guatemala since 2012. Over the years our church has sent numerous teams of older youth and their chaperones to the center to help in many ways. This year, we have the opportunity to take another team of adults (age 18 and older) for a week of mission involvement with GSM. The dates for our trip are **November 3-10, 2018** (give or take a day depending on flight arrangements).

North Carolina Baptists on Mission (NCBM) has been sending teams to Guatemala since 2011 in an effort to reach the local

people for Christ at the GSM Center near the city of Quetzaltenango. Good Shepherd is also blessed to partner with the Baptist Children's Homes of NC in the operation of the Good Shepherd Children's Home, also in Quetzaltenango.

GSM is involved in three primary missionary causes in Guatemala. They operate the Good Shepherd Training Center, the Good Shepherd Children's home and the Good Shepherd Clinic.

The Good Shepherd Health and Training Center is in a beautiful Mayan village, Chirijquiac. There are 13 villages in the immediate surrounding area which allows for easy access to the center and clinic. The center is the heartbeat of the ministry and its mission is to equip and train Guatemalan believers in a culturally-relevant way so that they can go and reach their own people for Christ.

The Good Shepherd Clinic is located at the Health and Training Center. Excellent patient care, coupled with purposeful evangelistic ministry, is the heart and soul of the clinic. In the first year of its opening, 2013, the clinic saw over 2000 patients and this number has remained steady. In 2016, a total of 1986 patients were seen, and a

Christian counselor was added to the staff who sees clients once a week. Many of these patients (30%) have chronic diseases such as diabetes, hypertension, and heart disease which have not been treated because of severe poverty. The clinic offers low cost visits and a pharmacy in a caring, culturally-relevant atmosphere.

The clinic is staffed by Christians and serves the local communities not only on-site but also holds mobile clinics and makes evangelistic home visits every Friday. The clinic must operate within budget constraints, with patients paying a symbolic amount for services rendered.



The Good Shepherd Children's Home ministers to the disadvantaged and forgotten children of Guatemala in the name of Christ. It has helped over 90 children since its opening in July 2014. The children come from heartbreaking situations and are in desperate need of physical, emotional, mental and spiritual help. The desire is to have a maximum impact upon the children's lives through Christ. This is achieved through a combination of cultural relevance, living in a purposeful Christian environment, and becoming a part of the Good Shepherd family.



The older children attend school and have a tutor who helps them attain age appropriate placement. They are also enrolled in special classes such as swimming, gymnastics, piano, voice, computer and sewing as their interests warrant. They are active in Judah Baptist Church, where they sing in the choir and attend Sunday School as well as compete on a Bible quizzing team. The home is financed through GSM with primary funding from our partner, Baptist Children's Homes of NC.

Are you interested in going to Guatemala with First Baptist? While there, our primary tasks will be to work with the children's home and the children. A new cottage is being built to house an even larger community of orphans and abandoned children. By the time we get to Guatemala, children will be living in this cottage. But, more work will need to be done to the facilities. Our tasks will include things such as woodwork, painting, ceiling placement, trim work, finish work, etc. We could also be building "Frontier Furniture" for some of the rooms. It is difficult to give exact details of our duties this far in advance.



To register or to get more information, please contact Dr. Richard Seagle. Approximate cost for the trip will be \$500.00 (depends on the number off people who go) plus about \$150.00 spending money. We can take up to 12 people. A \$250.00 deposit will save your spot. This can be given to Dr. Seagle by July 31, 2018


